Selections may be from the Miami-Dade County District's Summer Reading List found on David Fairchild's web page or by student's interest. <u>Selections should be made based on student's reading level and should not include the two novels that will be read in class.</u></p> <p><b>MATH:</b> Your child memorizing the times tables is an important part of the third grade. Study the times tables 1-12. <u>Students should master at least up to the 6 times tables before the start of the third grade.</u> All of the times tables must be memorized by December of the third grade school year and will be studied and tested on a daily basis. Getting a head start is extremely important!</p>
